LEARNER AT THE CENTRE-DIVERSITY-SOCIAL NATURE OF LEARNING

The teachers at Seaford Park Primary School are currently demonstrating the Social Nature of Learning through their engagement with the report writing process. Reports are prepared by the teachers twice per year and involve a huge amount of assessment, reflection and dedication by the teachers to ensure that their judgements are an accurate reflection of the progress made by the students in our school. Reports will be released in the last week of term and parents will be invited to discuss the content of the report with the teachers early in Term 3.

We have a Curriculum Day coming up on June 9th, the focus of which will be further professional development for teachers on the Seven Steps to Writing Success approach that we introduced this year. I'm sure you have heard your child/ren mention how the start to their stories are starting to sizzle and they are learning a range of techniques to tighten the tension and you will have also noticed work samples of students' writing in our newsletter and social media. The approach has had a big impact and we are excited about learning more.

Of course, the quality of our students' writing is impacted by the quality and quantity of reading with which they engage. To that end, the English Priority Team have been working hard to build our library of books available in the classrooms, in the school library and in the books that the students take home to read as part of their learning progression. If you have walked through the library recently, you will have noticed that the Children's Book Council of Australia shortlisted books for 2023 have arrived; in the classrooms, the teachers are using mentor texts to provide exemplars of Sizzling Starts and Tightening Tension and the team have prepared an order of books for our guided reading sets and our take home books. This investment will provide an excellent opportunity for our students. Parents and carers can help at home by chatting to your child/ren about books, reading together on the couch after dinner or before bed, making up alternative endings, investigating the words and sentence structure that authors use and that your child/ren can use in their writing, and generally enjoying engaging with books together as a family and independently.

Alongside their experiences of the interdependent nature of reading and writing, the students in 34J have been learning about interdependence in nature! See their article on the next page for more information.




News from 3/4J

This last month the 3/4s have been investigating a Big Idea for Biological Science.

The Big Idea is around the interdependence of species within an eco-system. To help us really understand how species do depend on each other we have been investigating Peculiar Pairs from this book.

What makes this relationship between the Blue-banded Bee and the Guinea Flower is the bee holds on to the flower and quickly vibrates its flight muscles in order to stimulate the flower. The flower drops the pollen on the bee and the bee flies to another plaint and starts the pollination process. The climbing guinea flower can't release any of it's pollen any other ways to this pair is important.

IGNITE THE SPARK

Over the past 12 months, we have raised over \$35,000 locally as part of our Ignite the SPark campaign. We have used the money raised to :

- Replace the furniture in five more classrooms
- Replace the goal posts on the oval, which will be installed this term
- Upgrade our reading resources in the classrooms and in the school library



Our current focus is on providing high quality take-home books for the students so they can practise their targeted skills with their family and friends. We are hoping to pay for our new resources with \$10,000 coming from the school budget and the remaining \$10,000 paid for using locally raised funds. Once we have achieved this fundraising target, we will begin working on replacing all of the bubbler taps around the school with more functional and user friendly alternatives.

We are very grateful to all families who have supported our efforts.







ANNUAL REPORT, 2022


School Council prepares an annual report each year. The report outlines the position of the school in relation to:

- Progress towards strategic goals, student outcomes and student engagement (learning, wellbeing, engagement and financial performance)
- Performance summary
- Learning
- Wellbeing
- Engagement
- Financial performance and position

Some of our highlights include:

- The percentage of students at or above age expected standards is higher than similar schools and around the same as state averages in both English and Mathematics.
- Our Year 3 NAPLAN results are significantly higher than both similar schools and the state average.
- 97.4% of students in Years 4-6 feel connected to the school. This is significantly higher than both state and similar schools.
- 99.4% of students positively endorse the school's approach to managing bullying.


