Thank you to all the parents, carers and guardians who have completed our survey. Over half of our families have responded, which provides valuable information for our school as we head into our review. We are incredibly grateful to the students who encouraged parents to scan the barcode and answer the questions, to School Council for promoting the survey in our community

and to everybody who took the time out of their busy day to provide their feedback. If you haven't completed the survey yet, there is still a few days left – simply scan the QR code using the camera app on your mobile phone and enter the School PIN, which you'll find on Compass (we are not permitted to publish the PIN on any communication that is distributed outside our closed networks). Parents, Caregivers and Guardians are



invited to inform the school office once the survey is complete so we can deliver a very special badge to their child/ren as a thank you.

As we head towards the end of Term 3, I want to acknowledge the dedication and commitment of the staff who have stepped up and supported their colleagues as we have struggled through staffing shortages. We have been forced to cancel specialist classes, take on extra responsibilities, cover additional classes and skip lunch to supervise playtime. All the staff have attended to the extra workload with a smile. For that, I am very grateful, and I hope that the parent community take the opportunity before the end of the term to express their appreciation. This week, we completed the recruitment process and have employed an additional teacher, Ishak Bashir, who will work with us until the end of the year. Ishak will step in to take classes when teachers are absent and will provide time release for teachers to complete tasks associated with our school review that will run in Term 1. We have also completed the recruitment process for an integration aide. We will be sad to bid Natalie Shannon farewell at the end of Week 9 but wish her all the best of luck as she engages in her early childhood education studies. Casey Dawson will begin with us on the first day of Term 4.

The students have absolutely loved engaging in their weekly Auslan lessons this year. It's exciting to see the students signing to each other on the yard and during transitions around the school. They are excited by and energised about this new method of communicating. Have a read about what they have been studying on the next page.

The whole school has been working towards learning the Australian Anthem, Advance Australia Fair, in Auslan. This involves understanding English words, their meaning, and how these translate into Auslan signs. Auslan has its own grammar and does not swap words for signs. Prep students up to Year 6 are working to memorise this for our whole school assemblies. Watching the classes sign is a very moving and surreal experience. I hope to see you at assembly when your children are ready to share their expertise.

The lighting premiership is on the 25th of August. We will be traveling to Mahogany Rise to play with all the 5 different


schools. The students will play 3 different sports Netball, T-ball and Football. We are all hoping that we have a very good time and wish us luck!

ATTENDANCE

Our whole school attendance rate is currently 90.4%. On average, the number of unapproved absences for each student is 4.2 days. Could parents please make sure that they log in to Compass and make an absence note if their child is not coming to school.

If your family is planning on going on holiday during school time, please write an email to Mr Halpin. We need to keep track of people who are going on holidays and if they are away for an extended period of time, we provide them with some work to do.

This term, the *Student Action Team for Improved School Attendance* have rewarded twelve people with a special lunch. Student attendance is monitored each fortnight and those children who have attended school regularly go in the draw for a special lunch which is awarded at each assembly. One award is given to a student in each learning area of the school, Junior (Prep to Year Two) Middle (Years Three and Four) and Senior (Year Five and Six).

Each term we have a major prize draw for the children who have achieved 95% attendance or above without being late to school. Periods of illness are removed from the data because we cannot help being sick and we certainly can't come to school when we are sick.

Term One's major prize was a family pass to Funtopia and was won by Sam in Year 6. The major prize for Term Two was a family pass to Bounce in Keysborough; Mackenzie B was awarded this prize.

Members of our *Student Action Team for Improved School Attendance* wrote to these two organisations and asked them to support our school by providing attendance prizes. We are very grateful for their support! I wonder what we can secure for Term Three's prize.

IGNITE THE SPARK

Over the past 12 months, we have raised over \$35,000 locally as part of our Ignite the SPark campaign. We have used the money raised to :

- Replace the furniture in five more classrooms
- Replace the goal posts on the oval, some of which have been installed, and purchase new safety pads
- Upgrade our reading resources in the classrooms and in the school library



Our current focus is on providing high quality take-home books for the students so they can practise their targeted skills with their family and friends. We are hoping to pay for our new resources with \$10,000 coming from the school budget and the remaining \$10,000 paid for using locally raised funds. Once we have achieved this fundraising target, we will begin working on replacing all of the bubbler taps around the school with more functional and user-friendly alternatives.


We are very grateful to all families who continually support our efforts.











