#### LEARNER AT THE CENTRE-DIVERSITY-SOCIAL NATURE OF LEARNING

Work has already begun in preparation for 2024. The teachers have started discussing the grade structure and the class allocation for staff. As you can imagine, this is a long and involved process with balance being the key consideration. The whole staff are involved in this process and meet weekly to discuss what 2024 might look like at Seaford Park Primary School. Throughout November, the students will be placed in different groups as we trial the structure and your child will likely work with a range of teachers and integration aides. The final grades will be announced on our whole-school 'Up Day', scheduled for Tuesday, December 12th. Sometimes, children can become worried at this time of the year as they prepare to move into a grade that is different to some of their friends so it is up to the adults in their lives to remind them of the opportunities that new beginnings offer. There are lots of things that will remain the same in 2024 – we will still mix up the groups at certain times of the day, depending on the activity/task; we will still eat lunch at the same time and see all of our school mates on the yard; we will still do Visual Arts, Performing Arts, Auslan and Physical Education every week; we will still have assembly every second Friday... the list goes on. We are also continuing to build our culture of professional learning communities, which means that all of the students will spend time working with students from other grades and the teachers will plan together to ensure that every student experiences the same curriculum and will follow very similar expectations, regardless of the grade in which they are placed. We will provide more information on how 2024 will run in our November and December newsletters. In the meantime, there is still a lot of work to be done in 2023. Teachers are busy planning the last few weeks of learning for your child and have also started assessing their progress so you are presented with the most accurate and relevant information on your child's achievements this year. Reports will be published in Week 11, which allows one week for you to check in with your child's teacher if you have any questions or require further information.

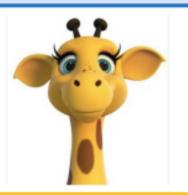

In Maths Enhancement we have been continuing to work on efficient mental strategies to add and subtract 1 and 2 digit numbers to 30 and beyond, which is an important step for developing efficient mental strategies for the multiplication facts to 100.





We have also been learning about aspects of daily life and identifying how some things have changed over time, while others have remained the same. We have also looked at how the present, past and future are signified by terms indicating and describing time. As part of this we have learned about seasonal calendars, including the Aboriginal seasons.

#### IGNITE THE SPARK

Over the past 12 months, we have raised over \$20,000 locally as part of our Ignite the SPark campaign. We have used the money raised to:

- Replace the furniture in five more classrooms
- Upgrade our reading resources in the classrooms and in the school library



Our current focus is on providing high quality take-home books for the students so they can practise their targeted skills with their family and friends. We are hoping to pay for our new resources with \$10,000 coming from the school budget and the remaining \$10,000 paid for using locally raised funds. Once we have achieved this fundraising target, we will begin working on replacing all of the bubbler taps around the school with more functional and user-friendly alternatives. We are very grateful to all families who continually support our efforts.

Ever wanted to give athletics a go? Meet new friends, spend quality time with family, have fun and achieve your personal best?

Free home-based assessment and treatment for 7 to 12 year old children with fear and anxiety disorders.

Does your child become very afraid of certain situations or objects, worry about a lot of things, get very distressed, or try to avoid things they fear?

#### About the study

Our team at Griffith University may be able to assist you. We are conducting a nationwide study that includes the following services at no cost to families:

- · A thorough assessment of your child's anxiety with a trained psychologist via the telephone;
- · Your child receiving one of two kinds of homebased treatments delivered on a PC, laptop or
- · Two follow-up telephone assessments with a trained psychologist 6- and 12-months after treatment to track your child's progress.

The study aims to find out if these two treatments are as effective as each other, and which children have the best response to each kind of treatment. This will mean that there are more evidence-based treatments available for helping anxious children.

#### About the treatments

Each treatment involves your child completing treatment sessions at home on a PC, laptop or tablet.

Each treatment involves your child learning practical strategies to better manage anxiety.

- One treatment helps children learn to control the focus of their attention on helpful things around them.
- The other treatment helps children learn to think differently and approach things they fear.

Each treatment includes information, telephone or email support for parents in assisting their child to better manage anxiety.

Prior studies have shown that children who complete each treatment experience significant reductions in anxiety.
