LEARNER AT THE CENTRE-DIVERSITY-SOCIAL NATURE OF LEARNING

As we begin the final few weeks of the term and the school year, the School Improvement Team have been reflecting on the development of our school and the areas for focus in 2024. We are extremely proud of all the work that has gone into improving the Writing approach at Seaford Park – Seven Steps to Writing Success – and want to congratulate all of the staff for their dedication.

The major impact has been that our students are now eager to write and can't wait to come in from the yard so they can get on with their writing. This motivation and enthusiasm will serve them well as we continue to grow, learn and develop in 2024. We are also proud of the learning in Mathematics and have seen a significant difference in the autonomy of the students. They have begun to understand that, when they work hard at something, set goals and focus, they can have an impact on their own learning outcomes and experiences at school.

Going forward, the work will continue in Writing and in Mathematics and the staff are currently reflecting and strategising about how we can improve student agency in our classrooms. The teachers have engaged in professional reading and observations of our students to develop an approach to implementing high impact teaching strategies and are already considering what that will look like in 2024.

The School Improvement Team also worked on the development of our Teaching, Assessment and Reporting Framework (TARF), which includes a statement of how and what we teach, a two-yearly overview of our curriculum approaches and an assessment schedule. <u>You can read our Curriculum Statement by clicking here.</u>

Another big piece of work will be the development of our Digital Technologies curriculum so watch this space for more exciting information on this important area of the curriculum.

We had an extremely high response rate to our Parent Opinion Survey in Term 3 and are grateful to everybody who responded. Once again, the frequency of teacher communication was raised as a focus area for our school and we will provide more information on how we will build on that in 2024.

As our Prep grade start to prepare for Year 1, they have been learning about ordinal number – have a read through their article on the next page to learn about their work on this foundational skill.





Maths in Prep S!




This term in Prep S, we have been learning about ordinal numbers, and the way we use them to position things in an order.



IGNITE THE S.PARK

Over the past 12 months, we have raised approximately \$20,000 locally as part of our Ignite the S.Park campaign. We have used the money raised to:

- Replace the furniture in five more classrooms
- Upgrade our reading resources in the classrooms and in the school library



Our current focus is on upgrading the external bubbler taps so the students have access to water throughout the day at school, including playtime. We hope that the taps will include an option for the students to refill their water bottles. The total cost will be approximately \$20, with \$10,000 coming from the school budget and the remaining \$10,000 paid for using locally raised funds. Once we have achieved this fundraising target, we will shift our focus to replacing the classroom library furniture, thus improving the reading experience and motivation for students to engage in reading. We are very grateful to all families who continually support our efforts.



57% of Victorian students say they want to make their way to school by cycling or another form of active travel. ActivePaths supports them in doing so. In conjunction with the local council and the school community (teachers, students, parents/school committee), safe routes to school are identified. Decals (durable stickers) are then placed on the most common and safest paths. Cycling, walking, scooting or skating to school becomes even more fun and parents are reassured: their children are following safe routes.


Students who actively travel to school arrive more focused and ready to learn than those who are driven.


